

Basics:



- OMiES is 100% online.
- The teaching/learning process is conducted in the *PLATEA* (Moodle) platform.
- Generally speaking, there are no synchronous sessions. Students work autonomously with the materials contained in the different folders, following the provided insructions.
- A tutor is assigned to each student to supervise the elaboration of the Master's Dissertation.
- Vive sessions for the Master's Dissertation are also online, unless otherwise requested by the student.

PLAGIARISM



- Students must be the original authors of their MA Dissertations. Therefore, using texts or ideas from other authors without acknowledging them is plagiarism. Plagiarism is a serious offence.
- The following situations are considered to be direct plagiarism:
 - If you present a project which was previously written by another person or workgroup as your own project.
 - If you change words or sentences, or word order, from an original text without quoting its source.
 - If you copy a text verbatim partially or entirely without quoting the original author/source.
 - If you combine paragraphs which were copied verbatim from one or more documents and you present them as your own work.
 - If you copy and paste a picture, a graph, a table or a chart without quoting their source.
- If detected it will result in the immediate disqualification of the student to take the current call or in a 0 grade for the TFM.
- Should the student commit the same infraction again, the Master's Academic Board will open a Disciplinary Proceeding against the student and will request the University to immediately expel him/her.

Artificial Intelligence generated texts



- The use of A-I generated texts at any point during the elaboration of the TFM (drafts, revision or final version) is strictly forbidden.
- If detected it will result in the immediate disqualification of the student to take the current call or in a 0 grade for the TFM.
- Should the student commit the same infraction again, the Master's Academic Board will open a Disciplinary Proceeding against the student and will request the University to immediately expel him/her.
