Oxford EMI

Universities and institutions around the world are rapidly internationalising. This means that faculty members are faced with the challenge of teaching all or part of their academic subject (Engineering, Science, Math, Business, Humanities) through English Medium Instruction (EMI).

"The use of the English language to teach academic subjects in countries or jurisdictions in which the majority of the population's first language is not English." (Dearden. J, 2015)

Who is this course for?

Academic subjects

The EMI Course for University Lecturers is for teachers of all academic subjects who teach or are going to teach through English.

The courses are also suitable for lecturers in Vocational Education.

Teaching experience

New and very experienced teachers join the Oxford EMI courses. For teachers of undergraduate to PhD students, very large classes, labs, seminars and supervisions.

English language requirement

Training takes place in English, participants need to be able to follow. Participants' English does not need to be perfect. We recommend the equivalent of:



Courses in Oxford, UK

2-week courses in Oxford

Open Course

We run courses with open enrolment on a regular basis throughout the year. These courses are suitable for individuals and institutions sending small numbers of teachers.

Participants come from different institutions, departments and subject areas. This can lead to international links, research projects and partnerships.

Courses around the world

1-week courses at universities around the world

Open Course

A university hosts the course and invites teachers from other universities in their country or region of the world to join. These inter-university courses help institutions in the same country or region of the world to benchmark and compare notes on their EMI provision. They also help to create links between the different institutions by bringing academics together.

Examples:

- 1. In Japan, these courses bring together leading universities from across the country, including many from the Ministry of Education's Top Global University Project.
- 2. In Europe, where universities from a geographical area are increasingly working together to attract international students, these courses bring together partners in a consortium.

Bespoke Course (minimum 20 participants)

Course outcomes

- Confident teaching your subject through English in an international university
- Better at communicating information and concepts through English to your students
- More confident in planning EMI courses, delivering classes and supporting students in their learning
- Aware of a wide range of methodological techniques for teaching multicultural, multilingual classes
- Able to observe colleagues teaching and give constructive, critical feedback

Course objectives

The course will:

- Build an understanding of the issues in EMI, based on current research
- Develop your language awareness and communicative skills
- Provide you with a range of teaching techniques for international classes
- Give you advice relevant to your specific teaching context
- Help you practise new skills by planning and teaching a sample lesson
- Support you with comprehensive individual feedback on your teaching

A team of EMI experts

The Oxford EMI team consists of experienced researchers, EMI teacher-trainers, materials writers and international education consultants.

Oxford EMI Training, a division of Oxford EMI Ltd, was founded in 2016 by Julie Dearden in order to provide professional development opportunities to EMI teachers in Higher Education. Her academic and professional background have been key to the development of Oxford EMI Training. Julie Dearden was Senior Research Fellow in EMI at the Department of Education, University of Oxford until 2016. In her 2015 global research into EMI in 55 countries, Julie found that 83% countries did not have enough qualified teachers to teach through EMI. In addition, there were very few guidelines to support EMI teaching and learning. These findings, along with her experience as an Oxford University teacher of international Masters students, as a Senior EMI researcher and her many years' experience as Director of International Programmes inspired the creation of Oxford EMI Training.

Each team member brings with them their expertise in international higher education; research into EMI, active learning and teaching, professional development, testing and the use of technology in Education.

The Head of our Training team is Tom Spain. As EMI Consultant and Senior Trainer, Tom Spain has worked in EMI for the last fifteen years – as a consultant, course writer and trainer. He wrote and delivered EMI courses both in Oxford and throughout Europe, Asia and North Africa. Tom also worked with lecturers from a wide range of disciplines delivering EMI modules and degree courses at the University of Alcalá in Spain. He worked at the Department of Education, University of Oxford as EMI Tutor and Research Assistant.

Tom is responsible for our international team of trainers. Together they ensure that all of our courses are of the highest quality and that each course is tailored to individual participants' needs.

Our team of experts in Oxford, many of whom are teachers and researchers at the University of Oxford, all contribute to making your course a success.
