- Study of body and health condition, reproductive status and growth cycles of game mammals
- Development of bioindicators as new monitoring tools for cervid populations and their habitats
- Intra- and inter-specific differences in diet, habitat selection and use of space and time between *Cervus elaphus* and *Dama dama* in Mediterranean ecosystems
- Studies of bone and dental histology in Mediterranean vertebrates and their application in current wildlife and in paleoecology
- Monitoring of populations of Canis lupus signatus and Lynx pardinus in Eastern Sierra Morena
